Parents,

Summer is just around the corner, which means it will soon be time for Cub Camp. Our SES Cub Camp is designed to provide your children with the opportunity to have fun and learn with friends during the summer in a Christian and caring environment. We have 8 weeks of planned activities for our campers. Activities will range from arts and crafts inside to water days outside. A complete schedule will be provided as camp draws near.

Cub Camp is open to children ages 3-12 (must be potty-trained). Registration is \$40 (this includes one camp shirt – additional shirts are \$10 each). SES Cub Camp begins May 30th and runs through July 28th. There will be no camp the week of July 4th. Camp hours are from 7:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Weekly camper rate is \$175/week, for a family of two it will be \$300/week, and for a family of 3 it will be \$425/weekly. Now through May 25th, we are offering a discounted rate if you pay-in-full, for the entire summer, for one child it is \$900, for a family of two it is \$1,500, and a family of three is \$2,150. If you chose to pay weekly, payments will be due the Monday your child attends. Any student attending Cub Camp this summer must register by May 25!

Camp dress code includes shorts, comfortable yet modest shirts, socks, and closed-toe tennis shoes. Crocs[™], flip-flops, and sandals may ONLY be worn on WATER days. Campers should have a bag (duffel, tote, or backpack) with a change of clothes, swimsuit, towel, refillable water bottle, age appropriate book, item for quiet time, and sunscreen each day attending camp. Items brought to camp should be labeled with the child's name, as Cub Camp is not responsible for lost items.

St. Elizabeth 2023 Summer Cub Camp Information

- The school gate will open at 7:30 AM for drop off in the cafeteria and will remain open till 9:00 a.m. at which time it will be locked. It will remain closed until 4:30 PM for pick up. If a parent needs to pick up a camper between 9:00-4:00, please call our After Care line (985)369-8546.
- A permission form needs to be completed and kept on file to participate in any activities, no exceptions.
- Each camper will pay for his/her own snowballs, \$1.50. A suggestion is to turn in an envelope with cash marked with your child's name for the snowballs and when depleted, it will be returned for replenishing.
- Every camper should have a bag (duffel, tote, or backpack) with a change of clothes, swimsuit, towel, refillable water bottle, age appropriate book, item for quiet time, and sunscreen on each day attending camp.
- Campers entering PreK3-PreK4, for the 2023-2024 school year will have a daily rest time. A mat and blanket/towel should be brought every Monday and will be sent home on Friday for cleaning. Stuffed animals/dolls will be allowed but must be put away after rest time.
- Campers entering 1st 8th for the 2023-2024 school year will have daily quiet time. Books, journals, and sketch pads are suggested. Electronics with headphones will be allowed only during quiet time. A mobile Chromebook lab will be accessible periodically throughout the summer.
- Campers that have a bike and want to ride in the back yard during outside time can bring it daily or may bring it on Monday and take it home on Friday.
- Lunch should be packed in a lunch bag and contain enough food and drink to last until snack time in the afternoon. No items containing peanuts will be allowed due to possible allergies of campers. A microwave will be available if you pack something that needs heating. Only the Camp Staff will operate the microwave.
- Breakfast will consist of cereal, Pop-Tarts®, milk, and juice.
- Snacks will consist of fruit snacks, animal crackers, and chips.
- Water days will occur periodically throughout the summer but may not be every week.
- Every Wednesday will be snowball day, unless rain is in the schedule, then it will be pushed to another day. Students will be allowed to purchase an extra small snowball in a flavor of their choosing. Only a parent can change the size of snowball by notifying the SES Cub Camp staff beforehand.
- Every week will have crafts and activities based on age groups.
- Everyone will have DEAR (Drop Everything And Read) time (30 minutes). Campers will have to provide their own books.
- Camp will always have a craft table set up with craft supplies along with blocks, board games, and card games.
- Games/balls will consist of basketball, football, volleyball, whiffle ball, etc.
- SES is not responsible for lost/stolen/damaged items.
